FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK. . .

The Season of Lent begins this Wednesday with the Imposition of Ashes during our Ash Wednesday Service. It is a very moving experience and one that touches my spirit every year. But Lent is a season that tends to confuse and confound me as well.

My mind wants to equate Lent with Advent. During Advent, we are eagerly anticipating the birth of Christ. Advent is about hope, peace, love, and joy. It is about hope for the future. It almost feels like we are planning a baby shower for four weeks, just waiting for the joyous day to get here and we can celebrate the birth of the Baby Jesus.

But Lent is not about that same kind of joy and anticipation. Or is it?

Like Advent, Lent is a time for us to reflect and prepare, but it is a time of preparation for something much more solemn.

During Lent, we are remembering and commemorating the sacrifice that Christ made for us on the cross. On Ash Wednesday we mark ourselves with ashes, a sign of morning and contrition, and we hear the words, "from dust you came and to dust you shall return." We stop and think about our own mortality. The rest of the Season of Lent is spent reading about God's call to seasons of sacrifice in our lives. We hear scriptures about ritual offerings, fasting, and repenting before turning to the story of how our Lord and Savior was betrayed by a close friend, arrested, tried before a sham court on trumped up charges, tortured, and executed in the most brutal way humans have devised. The season takes on a much darker tone.

Here is where my mind and my spirit start to wrestle with each other. While I'm reading about fasting and torture and death, I can't set aside the fact that I know the end of the story. I know that after the sacrifice and the suffering, resurrection comes. I know that after darkness falls, the light returns and drives out the darkness. And because I know the end of the story, the darkness no longer frightens me. Suddenly, I have hope and peace and joy and love...just like I did during Advent.

So, the best I can do is to approach Advent and Lent as two sides of the same spinning coin. One had to happen to bring about the other. They are both part of God's plan for humanity.

Here are some March Birthday fun facts

March, considered to be the luckiest month, is the transition month between winter and spring. The start of Spring typically happens in the middle of the month, the exact day shifts slightly each year.

- March's Birthstone Aquamarine and Bloodstone which symbolize courage.
- March's Birth Flower Daffodil
- Astrology Zodiac Signs of March Pisces (February 19th-March 20th) and Aries (March 21st-April 19th
- In old Roman calendars, one year used to be ten months long, starting in March and ending in December.
- The name March came from the name Mars, the Roman god of war.
- The Vernal Equinox (March Equinox) marks the day when day and night are of equal length.
- On March 10, 1876, Alexander Graham Bell made the first-ever phone call. It was to his assistant, and he said, "Mr. Watson, come here. I want to see you."
- Monopoly was invented on March 7th, 1933.

- President John F. Kennedy founded the Peace Corps on March 1, 1961.
- The popular social media outlet Twitter was launched on March 21, 2006, with the first tweet going out the same day. It was posted by the founder, Jack Dorsey, which read, "just setting up my twttr."
- Saint Patrick's Day occurs every March 17th, celebrated to commemorate the day Saint Patrick died.
- Statistically, March is the most unproductive month of the year in the
 U.S. This is the result of the NCAA "March Madness". Some companies
 lose up to \$1.9 billion in wages paid to workers who were not productive
 and instead spent company time betting on the NCAA tournament.
- Back in the older days, March was when military campaigns would resume that had previously been put on hold for winter.
