

### From the Pastor's Desk...

As your pastor, there are obviously times where I plan and schedule things to occur a certain way at a certain time. There is a significant amount of "scripting" that goes into ordering the life of the church. But so much of what we encounter together as a church is completely unplanned and unscripted, yet somehow always seems to be just what we need at just the right time. Let me give you an example. Every month, I provide Retha with my scriptures and sermon titles, as well as the Call to Worship for the bulletin. I use something called the Revised Common Lectionary which gives me suggested scriptures based on the season of the Christian year. For instance, during Lent, it will give me scriptures to choose from that are about Jesus' life leading up to the week of his arrest and trial. Other times of the year, it will cluster scriptures based on a certain theme. That's why I don't preach on the resurrection scriptures during the Fall. Those are clustered around Easter. And I always try to come up with a Call to Worship that is based on the scripture or the theme of the week. During Holy Week, we have lunchtime devotionals and set up the Stations of the Cross in the Sanctuary as ways of setting your heart and your spirit right for the crucifixion and the resurrection. During Advent, we light the Advent Candles, one at a time, to bring visual imagery to the idea that the Light of the World is growing and is about to shine forth on Christmas morning. But more often than not, the things we encounter, the things we discuss, and the decisions we make are guided by others' timelines...or, more often than not, GOD'S timeline. That is the season in which we find ourselves as a church. The first Tuesday of November, Wesely Memorial made a HUGE step in living into God's calling for our lives and for our ministries. We formally separated from the United Methodist Church because we, as a body, felt we no longer had a place in that denomination based on some of its recent decisions. We did not choose the date that occurred. That was dictated to us by the administrative functionality of the denomination. We had no control over the timing of that meeting. And, we have no control over the timing of the seasons of the church calendar. For instance, Advent ALWAYS starts 4 Sundays before Christmas Day. That's not when WE choose to begin celebrating Advent...that is a reality dictated by a set calendar and recurring timing. However, those 2 events are perfect timing for us as a church. As we enter Advent, which is literally a time of preparation for the arrival of Christ...that is, preparing for God to do something new and wonderous in the world...we, as a church, are poised for God to do something new and wonderous amongst and through us. I am so proud of this church and your willingness to follow God's leading in your lives. And I know God is poised to do amazing things at Wesley Memorial Methodist Church. Here's to new beginnings!!!

It was a wonderful meal providing good food, great friends, entertaining conversations, and the enjoyment of fellowshipping with our Wesley family members.


### "It's the most wonderful time of the year" The Holiday Season is here!
